

Gym 77' Policies and Guidelines 2011 - 2012

1. PARENTS OF GYMNASTS POLICY

1. The public is invited to attend the Christmas and Year-End performances. Parents are invited to watch their child(ren) the 1st Friday of each month.
2. Please check when dropping off students that classes are indeed proceeding as scheduled. We may not have reached you, or a note sent home may have been missed.
3. Lump sum payment or post-dated cheques are required at the time of registration. A Gym-Sask insurance fee is also due before the first class. Your child may not participate until the fee is paid.
4. There is a \$20.00 charge on all NSF cheques.
5. No refunds will be given on missed classes except in cases of extreme illness. Please ask for the refund in writing to one of the executive members.
6. Gymnasts should report any injury to the coach, who will turn it in to the executive.
7. Children must be 3 years of age as of December 31st. Younger gymnastics children (ages 3 - 5) must have an adult or guardian present as they may have to use the washroom or may want to leave the class.

2. GYMNASTS POLICY

1. Your child should wear something that will be comfortable to move around in like shorts and t-shirts or gym attire such as gymnastics suits. Always come in bare feet, never wear socks or shoes.
2. Students may bring a water bottle to class. Sorry, no food is allowed.
3. **Gymnasts shall show the coaches, coaches helpers and any parent volunteers proper respect and courtesy.** The coach is in charge of all students during class time and will make decisions on matters of discipline and procedure concerning your child. He or she may be asked to take a seat to the side or step out of the gym for the remainder of the class, depending on the severity of the circumstance.

3. CRIMINAL RECORD CHECK

As of 2006, Gym Sask has made it mandatory for all coaches, coaches helpers, executive committee and any person in contact with your child to have a criminal records check. This is to ensure the safety of your child. Anything that may arise from this check will result in immediate dismissal.

4. WARNING AND DISMISSAL POLICY

The coach may issue a warning to a child for consistent misbehavior, endangerment of other gymnasts, lack of respect towards the coach, helpers or volunteers.

Warnings will be issued in the following order:

1. A verbal warning to the student
2. A time out away from the other students
3. A phone call from the coach to the parents/guardians
4. A written letter of dismissal from the Coach and Executive
